Spelling Shed will continue with focus spellings each week, linked to homework alongside grammar and punctuation learning.



As mathematicians...

Statistics



Complete, read and interpret information in tables, including timetables.

Multiplication and Division

Identify multiples and factors, including finding all factor pairs of a number, and common factors of two numbers. Know and use the vocabulary of prime numbers, prime factors and composite (non-prime) numbers

Establish whether a number up to 100 is prime and recall prime numbers up to 19.

Multiply numbers up to 4 digits by a one- or two-digit number using a formal written method, including long multiplication for two-digit numbers.

Multiply and divide numbers mentally drawing upon known facts Divide numbers up to 4 digits by a one-digit number using the formal written method of short division and interpret remainders appropriately for the context.

Multiply and divide whole numbers and those involving decimals by 10, 100 and 1,000.

Recognise and use square numbers and cube numbers, and the notation for squared $(^2)$ and cubed $(^3)$.

Solve problems involving multiplication and division, including using their knowledge of factors and multiples, squares and cubes.

Solve problems involving addition, subtraction, multiplication and division and a combination of these, including understanding the meaning of the equals sign.

Solve problems involving multiplication and division, including scaling by simple fractions and problems involving simple rates.

As theologians...

Children will be learning about Sikhism and the importance of leaders and teachers in this religion.

As computer scientists we will...

This half term we will be learning about internet safety. We will also be conducting research for fact files and creating presentations relating to our topics in class. We will also be continuing with our coding learning.

As artist and designers...

Children will be inspired by the paintings of Simon Hopkinson to create their own paintings in the style of Hopkinson and other artists.

As musicians...

We will enjoy an integrated approach to music where games, the dimensions of music (pulse, rhythm, pitch etc), singing and playing instruments are all linked. As well as learning to sing, play, improvise and compose with a focus song, we will listen and appraise other songs.

We will be thinking about positive role models and inclusivity. We will look in depth at British Values: what they are and why they are important to the British people.

As athletes...
