Personal, Social and Emotional Development

During this half term, the children are working on the transition to Year 1. Children will be directed to the different areas of learning before free-flow activities, which means that in their learning lab time the children rotate around the different areas of the classroom including the literacy, maths, creative and small world areas. The children will also be talking through what to expect in Year 1 and any concerns or questions they may have.

Literacy

The children are continuing to progress with their reading in their Monster Phonics groups. We have been focusing on learning how to spell the Reception high frequency words, such as they, my and like. The children are showing great improvement in their writing. We ask that you please encourage your child to write at home as much as possible to help build up their stamina for writing for starting year 1. At this time of year, the children perform best when they are encouraged by school and home.

Understanding the World

This half term the children will be focusing on The World and how we can take care of it. These two exciting topics will allow the children to explore the world around them and to discuss each other's likes and dislikes. Focusing on transition, the children will have the opportunity to talk about their thoughts of moving up to Year 1. The children will also be continuing to use the iPads to interact with age-appropriate programs and games.

Mathematics
