Year 4 Science Museum


This week Year 4 visited the Science Museum, where the children watched a fantastic show called 'It Takes Guts'. The interactive show took the children on an exciting journey to understand how the human digestive system works. The children were lucky enough to watch a live demonstration of how food from the mouth is broken down through an acid bath in the stomach, along metre after metre of pulsating guts and out the other end! This experiment brought our learning alive in a fun and educational way!

Debate Mate Launch

On Wednesday, Miss Hannon and Ms Eaves took 24 children from across Year 5 and 6 to the Debate Mate Launch. Taking place in Westminster, the children had an incredible day watching their first show debate and learning more about the Debate Mate club which begins next week. The show debate was on the topic of 'Should the government force people to be vegan?' The children had some strong ideas for both sides and came away feeling inspired and ready to begin their own debating.

Able Maths Day

A number of Year 5 and 6 students took part in an Able Maths Day at Monks Orchard Primary school on Thursday. The children had the opportunity to meet and be challenged by one of the UK's leading Maths tutors - Pete Hall. FOR - A Space For Kids In Our Local Forest

Council officers are considering options for the Visitor Centre in South Norwood Country Park. We know budgets are tight, but we want to see if it's possible to create a community space which could support outdoor learning for local school children.

This idea has the support of Oasis Ryelands, the wider Ashburton Park Oasis hub and many local parents. Most importantly, it has the support of children on the school's Eco Council who plan to write to their MP.

Unfortunately, no plans have been set out to involve the local community early in the review of options. There is a real risk that council officers will decide not to include a space for outdoor learning without first understanding the level of local support or the value a space like that would bring.


