Year 2 SATSs

Attendance Update

Whole school year to date as of April 2022: 95.2%

We encourage pupils of Oasis Academy Ryelands to maintain a high standard of attendance.

By law, all children of compulsory school age (5 to 16) must receive suitable full-time education. Parents/carers have a legal responsibility for making sure their child attends school on a regular basis. If they do not attend, the Educational Welfare Officer will need to make a referral to the Local Authority for consideration in relation to issuing a Fixed Penalty Notice where a child has missed 20 or more sessions within the previous 10 weeks without permission from school, or consider prosecuting you for an offence under the Education Act 1996. This may result in the Local Authority taking legal action against you in the Magistrates Court. Prosecution for failing to ensure regular attendance at school can be taken where a child is a registered pupil at a school. Prosecutions are in accordance with Section 444 Education Act 1996.

The Department for Education (DFE) has changed the law about holidays in school time. The new law states that headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time other than in exceptional circumstances. Low cost travel or arrangements made by a family member, lack of holidays or wellbeing due to the pandemic as well as parents not able to take annual leave in school holidays are not deemed to be exceptional circumstances.

Jewellery, Makeup Nail Varnish And Hair Dye

We know how tempting it is for children to experiment with adornments but ask you please not to let your child do this in school. It can cause upset and jealousy as well as, in the case of jewellery, present serious health and safety problems. Children are welcome to wear watches and stud earrings – no hooped earrings of any kind are allowed.

Nursery Spaces

Do you have a little duckling aged 3? - Apply now for a September 2022 place in our nursery.

Our Duckling class runs Monday to Friday and children attend everyday.

We run two 15 hour sessions: Mornings 8.30 - 11.30 and Afternoons 12.30 - 3.30.

Full Time places are also available.

If you are eligible for 30 hours free childcare from the government, you will pay £25 per week (£5 a day for lunch cover) and you will need to provide your child with a packed lunch. If you are not eligible for the funding, then the cost per week is £125. You will also need to provide a packed lunch for your child.

Wellbeing Tip of the Week

Managing Worries

From time to time, we can all feel worried, or uncertain about things, it is natural to feel this way, especially about the future, or things we have limited control over. However, too much worry can lead to feelings of anxiety and tension and that can often affect our wellbeing. Here are some tips that might help manage our worries:

- **The 5-year rule.** Think about whether this will matter to you in five years' time, will you even remember that you were worrying about this in five years, or even in a week, a month, or a year?
- **Writing solutions.** Write a list of things you could do to solve your worry, and if there's anything you can do now, then do it straight away. If not, make a plan of when, where and how you'll tackle the problem. When you've done what you can, continue with your day, and cast the worry aside.
- **Share your worries.** Worries do not survive well outside our heads. Talking to a friend or relative can help us see the bigger picture and think of different solutions.
