### Government Reforms

In our recent newsletter questionnaire, a request was made to include information on major Government initiatives in Education. In response to this request, there are two significant documents that have recently been released: the White Paper and SEND Review.

On 28 March, the DfE (Department for Education) published the schools White Paper "Opportunity for All". The key themes are: increased national targets for KS2 and GCSE; a trust led system by 2030 and trusts led by LAs (Local Authorities); how this is taken forward locally will need to be considered; a register of all children not in the school system; this development is welcomed and will give the LA (Local Authority) greater oversight and accountability; access to funded senior mental health lead; recruitment and career progression.

The SEND Review "Right Support, Right Place, Right Time" green paper is a response to the 2014 reforms. It is broken down into four areas: each element contains menus of support and tools to help develop skills further and includes interventions from both an academic and pastoral perspective.

- **Assessment and Screening:** This helps schools understand how well they know their pupils and includes lots of different ways to screen to help inform teacher planning
- **Quality First Teaching (QFT):** This supports teachers to be as inclusive as possible and is based on the Rosenshine Principles. The aim is to provide teachers with the resources to develop their craft
- **QFT+:** For those children not meeting age related expectations and includes menus of support linked to particular areas of need
- **Learning and Development:** this area focuses on the right training for the workforce.

**Please note: The last day for Enrichment Clubs is Friday 15th July, except for Sewing Club which will have one extra session on 20th July to make up for a cancelled session.**

Please can you ensure that you apply long-lasting, high factor sunscreen to your child, especially their face and neck before they arrive at school. Please also ensure that they have a sunhat that protects their head, face and neck, and provide them with a water bottle to keep hydrated. ### First Aid Courses

Year 5 completed a First Aid Course this week, intended to help the children become more risk aware and to equip them with skills to keep themselves safe and help others. This included how to respond to someone who is unconscious and the steps to take if someone is choking. A highlight of the morning was the hands-on experience of practising their abdominal thrusts using an anti-choking vest. The children had a great morning and learnt many important first aid skills.

Year 6 spent Tuesday in training to become First Aiders. Completing CPR on a mannequin and finding out about the appropriate actions when faced with cardiac incidents. Hawk and Eagle displayed impressive levels of maturity and asked some pertinent questions of the medic leading.
