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This Week's Adventures

Nursery: In Nursery, we have been learning about our five senses and how they help us make sense of the world. We have smelt smelling pots to identify what's inside them and we have been exploring textures inside a feely bag and have tried to describe what we feel or guess using the description someone else gives. We have also tested our listening skills by trying to identify different funny or familiar sounds, and we have explored how it feels to walk with our eyes closed! Next week we will use our sense of taste when we do some baking!

Reception: This week's topic was Friendship. The children discussed what friendship means, how friends share and care about each other, how they help and work together and how, sometimes, friends fall out. They listened to stories like *The Rainbow Fish*, *Should I Share my Ice Cream?* and *The Squirrels that Squabbled*. They shared their ideas on how conflicts could be avoided and resolved. In Phonics, the children learnt g, o, c and k sounds. In Maths, they were introduced to number 3, compared numbers using the correct mathematical language and played number games.

Year 1: This week in Year 1 we have been learning about what it is like in South Africa and how things might be similar and different from England. We looked at houses, food, sport, animals and languages and decided that we definitely wouldn't see a lion roaming around South Norwood! We are planning some exciting writing in English and will be retelling the story of *Stardust* next week.

Year 2: We can't believe we are nearly at the end of our first half term in Year 2! The children have been continuously working hard and impressing us teachers. In maths this week, we started a new unit, focussing on addition and subtraction and in particular number bonds. Please test your children at home, they should be able to confidently tell you their number bonds to 10. 'If I were in charge of the world' is the title of the poem we have been reading in English, we've started writing our own version of the poem thinking about all the things the children would want to change if they could, we've had some very funny idea like 'I'd axe sticky Brussel sprouts and mouldy cheese'. The children have been using contractions in their poems using words like 'I'd' rather than 'I would'. In RE this week, we learnt all about the Shabbat and why it is important to Jewish people. We used the glockenspiels in music, trying to play them in time to our song of this half term, *Hands, Feet, Heart* which we have really been enjoying. On Wednesday 19th October (next week) we are going on a trip of our local area to complete our geography topic of this half term. Please let your child's teacher know if you can help, the more the merrier!

Year 3: This week, Year 3 ventured out into lovely October sunshine and walked around their local area. They studied what was different and similar over the last 100 years. Throughout this trip, they showed joyfulness, self-control and were considerate in their community – well done to all our pupils and a 'huge' thank you to all the parents that could come on this trip! In English, we have been discussion and writing about a poem called 'Reflection of me'. The children have produced some high-quality vocabulary plus improving figurative language. Also this week, maths has been challenging. We have started to deal with adding and subtracting, crossing the 10s and applying our place value knowledge to 3- and 2-digit numbers. Lastly, PE was also hard this week as we focused on building our leg strength – try to show your adults at home some of the activities – complete some together over the long weekend to become stronger Year 3.

Year 4: This week, Year 4 have completed, edited and published final versions of their stories based on *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory*. We ended the week by starting our unit on poetry by Joseph Coelho. In Maths, the children have worked hard to develop their written addition strategies. In Science, we identified the organs and functions involved in the latter part of the digestive system. In Humanities, we thought about changes in our local area then looked at conditions in the main climate zones around the world, all mixed in with Art, PE and singing. Well done Year 4.

Year 5: Year 5 have continued their hard work this week by completing their first completely independent write of the year. We have seen some fantastic writing, where children have included similes and other vivid descriptions. In Maths, we have been building upon our skills of addition and subtraction. In Music, the children have been thinking about how music both makes us feel and how it affects other people. This also linked to our #HelloYellow day, where we thought about how music can have a positive impact on our mental health.

Year 6: Year 6 turned their narrative around to focus on Jeff's perspectives of the events in 'The Boy in the Girls' Bathroom'. We also looked at active voice. In Maths, we looked at negative numbers and related this to real life situations like temperature and money. In History, we considered how conquest and war have impacted British society over time by reflecting on the positive and negative impact of the Roman, Anglo-Saxon, Viking and Norman invasions. In Computing, we continued our coding lessons by creating sprites and assigning them costumes and behaviours.
