

A Message From Miss Reed and Mr Lillo

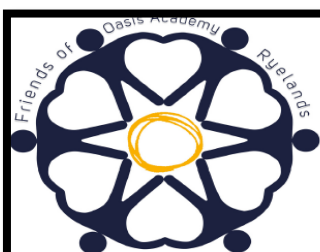
Dear Parents and Carers,

This Week's Adventures

Nursery: Nursery have been finding out where our food comes from before it reaches the shops and markets. We have talked about different types of farms and factories and learnt the difference between markets, supermarkets, butchers, bakers, greengrocers, delicatessens and fishmongers. We talked about the difference between natural food and processed food, and vegetarian, vegan and meat diets. We talked about where we shop for food with our grown-ups and what's on our shopping list. We also thought about how we pay for food (with coins, notes, cards and even our phones.) We tried to understand the meaning of the words expensive and cheap.

Reception: In Reception, this week's topic was "Celebrations around the world". The children started the week by listening and retelling the Christmas Story and by looking at how Christmas is celebrated around the world. They continued with learning about Hanukkah and Kwanza. In Write Away, they wrote their first letter to Santa telling him what they wish for Christmas. In Maths, the children were introduced to the concept of the part-whole model and learnt to partition numbers to 5.

Year 1: Year 1 have started learning about 2D and 3D shapes this week. We have named them, talked about their properties and sorted them into groups. We enjoyed looking around our environment to find lots of different shapes too! In Geography, we have learnt about the 7 different continents. We really enjoyed finding them and labelling our maps. In Science, we have started talking about different animals and their diets. We learnt about what carnivores, herbivores and omnivores eat and then made our own little lift the flap books with the information that we had learnt. Did you know that an ant was an omnivore? This week we have also started to rehearse for our Christmas performance that we are excited to show you soon!

Year 2: We started a new text in English this week, 'Meerkat Mail' by Emily Gravett. Before we read the story, we made predictions based on the front cover of the text and asked any questions we wanted to find out. Over the next few weeks, the children will be writing their own narratives based on the story. We began this week by creating our own character, the children came up with some fantastic adjectives and noun phrases to describe them. In maths, we have been learning about money, in particular being able to recognise coins and notes and understand the value of these. We have been continuing to learn about different things we can do to help save our planet and improve climate change, this week we looked at how our energy use can impact on the environment and created our own energy warriors. In geography, we compared England and India, looking at what differs between the two countries and what is similar. We used watercolours in paint to create a background for a painting inspired by artwork by JMW Turner. Keep a look out for the science homework this week, the children need to complete it to support them in our lesson next week.

Year 3: This week, well done to our Year 3 pupils who wrote their own amazing version of 'George's Marvellous Medicine' - great description, use of different punctuation and fronted adverbials to bring their narratives alive! In maths, we continue to move on with multiplication and division and are happy to report that pupils were able to apply the 2-, 5- and 10-times tables. Please keep working on the 2,3,4, 5 and 10-times tables at home and school, and this will mean that we shall have it firmly embedded by Christmas. Lastly, in art, we are learning about the impressionist painter, Claude Monet; he has been inspiring this week's artwork of 'The Water Lily Pond'. The children continue their efforts to develop their use of water colours and learn different brush stroke once used by Monet.

Year 4: Year 4 have enjoyed their learning this week. We have been writing narratives based on 'Moon Man' by Tomi Ungerer. In Art, the children completed their volcanic eruption pieces. In Maths, we have begun our unit on multiplication and division, and in science we conducted an enquiry into thermal insulators. In RE, we looked at the importance of Hindu Priests, and discussed the Rule of Law in PSHE.

Year 5: Year 5 have worked very hard this week. In Maths, we have been refreshing our understanding of multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 100. We have also been practising our arithmetic skills. We completed our independent writing task where we wrote a narrative and thought very carefully about our descriptions. In Art we learnt about Henri Rousseau and looked at some of his famous pieces of artwork ready for our art lessons over the next two weeks. We learnt about how day and night is caused by the rotation of the Earth around the Sun as well as how the moon's rotations causes different phases of the moon and even sometimes solar eclipses.

Year 6: Year 6 have 'read' the first chapter of 'The Arrival'. This book has no words and uses very detailed pictures to tell a story. We have started a first-person account of the man in the story leaving his family and written a farewell note from him to his daughter. In maths, we continued practising long multiplication including solving problems and then moved onto the short division method. In art, we looked at the work of Andre Derain in preparation to paint a picture inspired by his style. In RE, we read the story of Angulimala and thought about how it fitted with Buddhist teachings. We have been focusing on the habit of hopeful and thinking of ways we already demonstrate this habit. We set ourselves targets for being hopeful over the next week at school and home.
