If you are kindly in a position to donate a book to our school library and would like to make a purchase from this local multicultural bookshop, we would be very grateful. (*Books start from £4.99*).


The BookLove shop has made us our very own dream list of books chosen by us, the teaching and non-teaching staff of Ryelands and BookLove.

These amazing books are now all available to buy, to then be donated to our childrens' classrooms and library.




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The children have had a fantastic week celebrating World Book Day. During the week, the children enjoyed a range of fun activities, such as The Masked Reader and Reading Bingo. This week there were many opportunities for the children across the school to share their favourite stories with one another. It was lovely to see so many of the children and staff dressed up on Friday to celebrate their favourite stories. From our youngest children in Nursery to our oldest in Year 6, everyone made a huge effort and loved showing off their costumes in celebration assembly on Friday.



This Week's Adventures

Nursery: This week in Nursery we learnt all about nutrition. We found out which foods are good for us and which we should only have for occasional treats. We learnt about the effect the different food groups have on our health and well-being. We sorted food into groups: vegetables, fruits, carbohydrates, protein, dairy products etc and we found out why they are so good for us and how they help us to grow, stay well, give us energy. We also learnt about the harm having too many treats does us. We worked hard making collage plates of nutritious food and created a classroom display with them.

Reception: This week, Reception children have enjoyed the topic "Into the jungle". They have learned about various wild animals and their habitats and have been on a virtual trip to the zoo. The children thoroughly enjoyed the book gifted to them by the Book Trust and amazed the adults with the fantastic writing around the story "We're going to find the Monster". Throughout the week, they have read and listened to many of their favourite stories.

Year 1: This week in Maths we have started a new unit exploring height and length. We have started to explore objects that are taller/longer/shorter than each other and have used specific vocabulary to compare these. We have also started to measure things using non standard units, such as cubes. In English, we are continuing our writing journey with our book "The Storm Whale". In Science, we have looked at objects around the classroom and discussed what materials they are made from. In humanities, we have started to think about fast fashion and the affect that it has on our environment. We learnt all about the "journey of a t shirt" and how they are made.

Year 2: In Year 2 this week, we worked collaboratively to create a word bank of interesting and exciting vocabulary to describe the setting of the palace in the story 'Halibut Jackson'. The children used their iPads to uplevel their vocabulary which then supported them in writing a setting description. In maths, we began learning about lines of symmetry. We identified vertical lines of symmetry in shapes and even used our knowledge to draw the other half of a shape when a line of symmetry is given. In Science, we carried out an experiment to identify whether materials are waterproof or not and which materials would be best to build a wall of a house. In Geography, we identified the global goal that we will focus on this half term which is all about health and well-being. We looked at different physical features around the globe and thought about the place that we would like to visit that would help us to feel calm and happy. Year 2 are now using paper reading records again, please ensure that you are reading with your child and that their reading record is brought in every day.

Year 3: This week, Year 3 have been busy understanding different units of measure, including millimetres, centimetres, and meters! The children have worked very hard in working out equivalent measurements, although for some this has been challenging, they have all done so well. In English, children continue to write exciting sentences based on 'The Secret of Black Rock'. The children are becoming very confident in using adverbial phrases and speech in their creative writing. In art this week, children were outdoors looking for natural materials to include as part of their relief prints, children used twigs and leaves to produce a beautiful natural pattern. In Computing, children have been learning about self-image and identity and what this means and what this may look like online, we have recapped and discussed online safety rules. Kingfisher have been busy with their swimming lessons, which they have loved, it has been fantastic to see all children progress in their swimming skills. Well done Kingfisher!

Year 4: This week, Year 4 have started reading 'The Iron Man' by Ted Hughes. We have used the style of the author to write effective sentences for a story opening. In Maths, we have focussed on finding unit and non-unit fractions of amounts. As scientists, we explored how different sounds are made and as geographers we learned about the devastating impact of deforestation. In RE, we explored the importance of yoga and meditation to practising Hindus.

Year 5: In Maths we have been subtracting fractions and even though it has been difficult we were really hopeful and have made huge improvements in our understanding. In Geography, we looked at the water cycle and how it links to our Global Goals. As well as this we looked at the History of toilets and created our own timelines on this. We have done lots of other fun bits this week so please come to Heron Classes assembly on Thursday to find out what we have been learning!

Year 6: Year 6 continued reading 'Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone' by JK Rowling. We followed Harry's journey into the magical world where he fits a place called Diagon Alley. We used our senses and show not tell to describe this setting and Harry's reaction to it. In Maths, we finished our learning on fractions by learning how to find fractions of amounts and find the whole from a given fraction. In RE, we started to learn about Buddhist symbols and signs and then recapped our knowledge of the key features of 6 different religions. In science, we learnt about electricity and explored the different components of a circuit. In Reading, we have been focusing on the skills of predicting and explaining the impact of the author's language choices.
