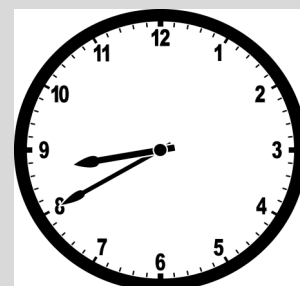
Soft Starts: Monday – Thursday from 8:40am

We would like to say thank you to all those children who came into school earlier this week for Soft Starts; people reported that this made a very calm start to the day.

The children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 continue to be invited and encouraged to come into school from 8:40am on **Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays.**

The aim of this slightly earlier start is to enable a slow and gentle start to the school day. The children will be welcomed into their classroom by their teacher and encouraged to complete low stakes, calming activities, possibly to some gentle music. This may involve looking at a book alone or with a friend, mindful colouring, free drawing, playing a calm game etc. During this time, the teachers will be able to chat with the children, see that everyone is ok and give attention to those that may need it. We are aiming to use this time to help develop the children's emotional wellbeing. The register will continue to be taken at the usual time, 8:50am and registers will close at 9:00am.

We would like as many children as possible to participate in these 'soft starts' so that we can explore the benefits for the children. Thank you in advance for your support.



This Week's Adventures

Nursery: The nursery children have been thinking about summertime this week. We thought about the changes to the weather, plants and animals in summer. Then we thought about how we adapt the way we live, our activities, clothes and food to suit the summer weather. Most of our week was taken up with practising for sports day which was on Thursday. We split into 3 teams and had a running race, a balancing a beanbag on the head race, a dress-up race, a pram slalom race and a balance bike race..... and most of the children managed to go in the right direction most of the time! We all had a really fun time and it was brilliant to see so many parents coming to watch.

Reception: This week's topic has been "People who help us" and although there are many people who help us every day, we have focused specifically on how firefighters, paramedics and police help us. They have discussed how to be careful around fire, who to call if they are sick or hurt and how to report a crime. The children did lots of creative and writing activities related to their topic. In Maths, we have continued practicing numbers to 20, addition and subtraction. On Thursday, Reception children took part in Sports Day and they impressed us with their team spirit, perseverance and determination.

Year 1: We have been practising our reading and maths skills this week and have been showing our teachers how much we have remembered over the course of Year 1. In RE this week, we were learning about humanists, what they believe in and how this is similar/different from Christianity. In Geography we undertook some fieldwork in our playground and used tally charts to see how many different bugs we could find. Well done to all of Year 1 for being such great sports on sports day. You all did so well!

Year 2: Year 2 have had a fantastic week of fun and learning. In English, we have been rewriting the story of The Tear Thief but we chose something else for the thief to steal, such as laughter and dreams. In our Maths lessons, we have been practising telling the time to o'clock, half past and quarter past and quarter to on analogue and digital clocks. We have also started to learn about the differences between males and females in our RSE lessons. We had a fantastic time on Sports Day and enjoyed trying lots of different sports and cheering our classmates on. Thank you to everyone who came to cheer us on! Finally, a big well done to Goldfinch class for their amazing Class Assembly! Don't forget to read and complete your reading record daily.

Year 3: Year 3 started the week with a lovely trip out to the Country Park. The children had the opportunity to complete part of their fieldwork project by designing a questionnaire about why local people were using the park. Our pupils were considerate, resilient and joyful throughout, whilst walking around for an hour and a half! Another trip dominated our week, Sports Day 2023. Year 3 high-jumped, sprinted, skipped and long-jumped incredibly well. Ably demonstrating all 9 habits in such hot weather- great effort, self-control and we are proud of their success!

Year 4: Another busy week of learning for Year 4, whilst making the most of the beautiful weather! Displaying many of the 9 habits, we have been working through our end of year assessments; our opportunity to shine and demonstrate our resilience and positive attitudes to learning. Sports Day was the highlight of our week, showing just how encouraging Year 4 are towards each other with a sunny morning of smiles and congratulatory cheers. With our dance festival just around the corner, Year 4 have been practising our routine, polishing up our moves to ensure that we dazzle you all with an outstanding performance!

Year 5: Year 5 have been very busy this week not only preparing for Year 6 by completing some practise SATs papers, but we also have been on 2 trips, completed a science investigation and made resist prints in Art. The children really enjoyed meeting Onjali Rauf, the author of The Boy at the Back of the Class on Monday; they were really interested about how her own personal experiences influenced her writing. They were also brilliant at Sports Day on Wednesday and we were really impressed with their positive attitude towards each activity. Well done Year 5!

Year 6: This week year 6 have been practising for the production: acting, singing and dancing. We have completed a number of science experiments including finding out which biscuit is best for dunking. We used our science learning on electrical circuits to build motorised cars. In RE, we started to draw our learning on Buddhism to a close by looking at Temples and celebrations. We enjoyed participating in Sports Day on Wednesday and on Thursday we had a fabulous time experiencing the rides at Chessington.
