We will also test our listening skills by trying to identify different funny or familiar sounds, and we will explore how it feels to walk with our eyes closed!



Things to do at home this weekend.....

Help your child to describe what they see, hear, taste, smell and touch. Model descriptive language to them and encourage dialogue with questions. For Example: I can smell the dinner, what does it smell like? What do you think it will taste like? Can you hear the rain/wind/tap running? What does it sound like? What noises can you hear on the way to school/park? What does a car sound like? Look like? How does a fir cone/conker/twig/leave feel/look/smell? Etc. Make your child's environment rich with language so they can expand their vocabulary and put together interesting simple sentences.
