## Next week's Topic: Something for Nothing (recycling)

We will be learning what 're-cycling' means and why it is good for our planet. We will discover the effect on the earth when we don't re-cycle and re-use things. We will decide what materials can be re-cycled and what they could be made in to. We will sort through objects that can be re-cycled and those that can't and try to understand why. We'll discover the harm plastic does to the oceans and think about what we should do with our old toys and clothes. We will also try to understand and why it's important not to waste food.

## Things to do at home.....

In the kitchen at home decide with your child what can be re-cycled or re-used and what can't. Show them how to separate packaging into Plastics and glass, paper and cardboard.

Re-enforce why it's important not to waste food

Decide as a family how to use less plastic

Practise counting: how many metal cans there are in the cupboard, cardboard boxes, glass jars and bottles. Count how many of your toys are plastic, how many are wooden?
