

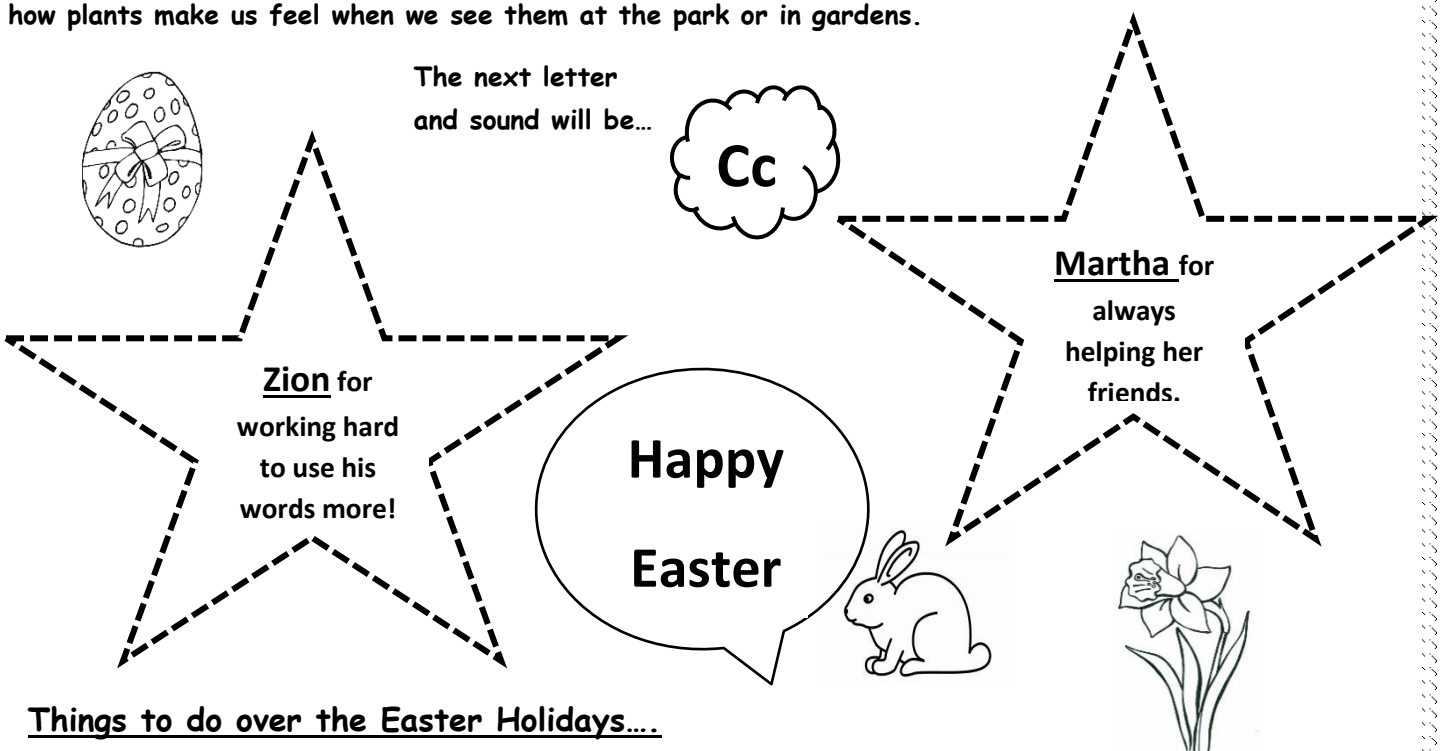

Topic first week back: Roots and Shoots

We will learn all about plants. We will learn to name the different parts of a plant and find out how each part has a function to help the plant grown and be healthy. We will order sequencing cards to help us plant cress seeds, and we'll water them to help them grow. We will talk about the plants we can grow to eat, the ones that help the ecosystem, and the ones that we definitely don't eat! We will think about how plants make us feel when we see them at the park or in gardens.



Things to do over the Easter Holidays....

- Collect objects beginning with the same sound and put on a tray or in a box. Name the objects for your child, stressing the initial sound and ask them to repeat it after you. Cover the objects with a tea towel and take an object away. Can your child remember the missing object? Change the game with different initial sounds
- General maths 1:1 counting, and if your child is ready ask them to count 2 groups to find the total to introduce them to addition.
- Please practice name writing using the tripod pencil grip **ESPECIALLY** the children that are going up to reception 😊
