We will learn about our five senses and how they help us make sense of the world. We will smell smelling pots to identify what's inside them and we will explore textures inside a feely bag and try to describe what we feel. We will also test our listening skills by trying to identify different funny or familiar sounds, and we will explore how it feels to walk with our eyes closed!

Things to do at home this weekend.....

You can help your child to describe what they see, hear, taste, smell and touch. Model descriptive language to them to encourage dialogue and questions.

For Example: I can smell the dinner I wonder what it will be. What does it smell like?
What do you think it will taste like?

Can you hear the rain/wind/tap running? What does it sound/look like?

What noises can you hear on the way to school/park? What does a car sound/look like? How does a fir cone/conker/twig/leaf smell/feel/look? What noise do they make as you walk on them?
