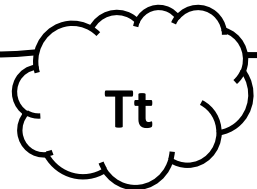

Next weeks topic: Staying safe

The children will learn how to stay safe. We will talk about stranger danger, getting lost, dangerous objects within the home, and road safety. The children will be encouraged to learn their house number and road name, and they will learn to ring 999 in an emergency situation if their carers are in difficulty. They will have fun dressing up as road safety characters as they learn how to how to cross the road safely.
