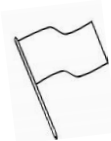

## Next Topic is.....

The nursery children will be learning about wind. We will discover what wind is, and we will think about the different types of winds there are (e.g. breezes, tornadoes, gales, hurricane etc). We will also find out which things need wind to make them move, such as balloons, windsurfers, yachts, flags, hang gliders, washing lines, windmills, gliders, turbines etc. We will have great fun making our own kites and paper aeroplanes fans and flags to wave!

## Things to do at home...

- Ask your child to describe what wind feels like. If they struggle for the vocabulary, then model descriptive words to them. (Soft, tickly, cool, soothing, exciting, strong, puff, blustery, breezy, blowy, drafty, stormy)
- Think about what familiar things can be moved by wind (rubbish, grass, washing, boats, leaves, hair, clothes, flowers etc)
- Older children sound out and try to write w-i-n-d, f-l-a-g, f-l-a-p, using correct letter formation
- Younger children practice recognising their name, initial letter and writing their name, always making sure they use a 'tripod' pencil grip.
