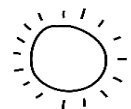
Juno for playing nicely and being kind to her friends

Things to do at home...

As you go about your daily life and routines point out things that are opposites.

Practice counting objects with 1:1 accuracy during everyday activities such as putting toys away. For example: how many cars are you picking up? How many cars are the same colour? Can you put 6 big forks and 3 small spoons on the table for me? How many socks are in the washing basket? How many cups do we need?

Practice listening to the initial sounds of words eg. a- a- apple, c-c-cat, d-d-dog
