

Phonics Screening Check Parent Meeting

2024

Year 1



The National Phonics Screening Check was introduced in 2012.

The check is statutory for all maintained schools.

This academic year, schools across England will administer the Year One Phonics Screening Check the week beginning Monday 10th June.

All pupils in our current **Year One** classes at Oasis Academy Ryelands will take the Screening Check.



The Phonics Screening Check is designed to show how well your child can use the phonics skills and helps to identify pupils who need extra phonics support moving into Year 2.

The screening check assesses whether your child is able to read/decode at an appropriate standard.

The Department for Education defines the checks as a "short, light-touch assessment" that take about four to nine minutes to complete.




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What does the Phonics **Screening Check consist of?**


The check consists of **40 words** that your child will be asked to read one-to-one with their class teacher.

There will be 20 'real' words and 20 'pseudo-words' (non-words/alien words).





Pseudo Words



Non-words (nonsense words, pseudo words, alien words) are a **collection of letters** that will **follow phonics rules** your child has been taught, but don't mean anything.

Each of the non-words is presented with a **picture** of a **monster/alien**.

Your child will need to apply their knowledge of phonemes to read these correctly, showing that they understand the phonics rules behind them.

The check is divided into two sections –



- Section 1: simple word structures of three or four letters (20 words)
- Section 2: more complex word structures of five or six letters (20 words)

How does school prepare the children for the check?



Daily Phonics lessons - since the beginning of Reception, covering all phase 2, 3, 4 and 5 phonics.

Termly **Mock** Phonics Screening Checks (using past papers)- the children are therefore, familiar with the process and the format of the assessment before June.

Assessment analysis - supports planning of lessons and interventions.


Daily reading of Monster Phonics eBooks.




Sound Buttons/ Dots and

Marking the Phonics Screening Check

The check will be carried out 1:1 and marked by your child's class teacher.

The check will be administered in accordance with the **Standards and Testing Agency's check administration guidance.**

Schools are monitored by **unannounced monitoring visitors** from local authorities in order to ensure that administration of the checks are accurate.

Reporting



All schools will report pupils individual score /40 to their Local Authority.

The threshold mark is communicated to schools by the start of July, **after** the test has been taken and all schools have submitted their pupils' scores.

Your child will be scored against a **national standard**, and their result will indicate whether or not they fall below or within this standard.



Threshold Mark

In previous years, the "pass threshold" was 32, which meant that children had to read at least 32 words out of 40 correctly.

At Oasis Academy Ryelands we pride ourselves on our phonics teaching. In previous years, our Year 1 results have been above the national average.



Informing parents and carers

Your child's end of year report will inform you of your child's score and whether they have reached the 2024 threshold or not.



How can you prepare the children for the check?

- Revising the phonics the children have already learned in Reception and Year One using the Daily Practice Videos.
- Weekly / daily phonics reading.
- Use the iPad for phonics games.
- Online phonics games.
- Sound buttons/Dots and dashes (spotting the digraph/trigraph)
- Applying their phonics in writing.

Read, read, read!



How can you prepare the children for the check?

During parents' evening, you will have discussed how your child is doing in phonics/early reading and your class teacher will have discussed any concerns they may have. If you were unable to meet with them or have concerns yourself, please find time to catch up with them.

We must remember this is an **in the moment assessment**, therefore it is vital that we all do our part to ensure the children are, not only, ready but unphased by the check!

Remember phonics is an every day occurrence for the children!
