### Communication, Language and Literacy, Personal, Social and Emotional Development and Physical Development, Literacy, Maths, Understanding the World, Expressive Arts and Design

In Reception this week, we have been thinking about our bodies and all the amazing things it can do. During the week, we named the parts of the body and learnt about the bones and key organs inside our body. The children enjoyed learning about the heart and how it pumps blood around our body, that our stomachs digest our food and that we breathe in oxygen and breathe out carbon dioxide. Once again, the children have shown fantastic sharing skills, with good listening and good talking. On Thursday the children listened to the NSPCC's song Talk Pants with Pantosaurus, the children learnt the following rules 1. Privates are private 2. Always remember your body belongs to you 3. No means no 4. Talk about secrets that upset you 5. Speak up, someone can help. In Monster Phonics this week, the children have been learning the sounds 'b' and 'h'. This has included how to say the sound, write the sound and thinking of words that begin with that sound. The children are continuing to read and write tricky words such as you, big, get, cat and dog.

In Write Away, the children have been drawing and writing about the things their bodies can do. On Wednesday to celebrate the wonderful costumes the children wore, they were encouraged to write the sentence I am a ... The children remembered how to form a capital I (yellow I) and a (angry a), both taught in our monster phonics lesson.

This week we have continued Mathematics Mastery. The children have continued to consolidate their learning of early addition adding two parts together to find the whole/total. The children continue to use concrete representatives such as linking cubes to support their development as well as the part, part whole model.

Over half term recap the sound we have learnt this half term, visit the monster phonics website,

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
Reception- term 1 week 1 to week 6, to explore some of the PowerPoints and videos we have been using in school.
