In Reception this week, we have been thinking about our friends. We have thought a lot about what makes a good friend and how we can be better friends to one another. During our morning 'Let's get together' carpet session we talked about how friends do not always agree but how we can resolve these disagreements. The children shared many fantastic examples with their partners. We also discussed how friends must share with one another. The children did a fantastic job at giving examples of times they have shared with their friends at school and outside of school. The children loved listening to the story 'The Squirrels Who Squabbles' by Tim Field, you can listen to the story at home on YouTube. During learning labs, the children enjoyed creating a variety of friendship crafts such as helping handprints, rainbow fish and friendship bracelets and necklaces.

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In Monster Phonics this week the children have been learning the sounds “i”, “n”, “m” and “d”. This has included how to say the sound, write the sound and thinking of words that begin with that sound e.g. ink, nip, map and dog. During Monster Phonics we model blending CVC words using dots and dashes, this encourages the children to hear each individual sound and see how letter blend into words.

In Write Away, we have been focusing on letter formation and pencil grip. Writing this week's letters and some CVC words that begin with these letters. The children are modelling excellent fine motor skills and are listening careful to the support and guidance from the adults on how to improve their writing. As children's writing skills improve, we look forward to extending the children's writing to link closer to our weekly topics.

This week we have continued our Maths carpet sessions focusing on numbers 5,6,7,8,9 and 10. The children have enjoyed many counting songs, number writing activities and using concrete resources such as cubes to represent these numbers.

Weekend Activities


