In Reception this week, we have been thinking about our bodies and all the amazing things it can do. During the week, we named the parts of the body and learnt about the bones and key organs inside our body. The children enjoyed learning about the heart and how it pumps blood around our body, that our stomachs digest our food and that we breathe in oxygen and breathe out carbon dioxide. Once again, the children have shown fantastic sharing skills, with good listening and good talking. On Thursday the children listened to the NSPCC's song Talk Pants with Pantosaurus, the children learnt the following rules 1. Privates are private 2. Always remember your body belongs to you 3. No means no 4. Talk about secrets that upset you 5. Speak up, someone can help. In Monster Phonics this week, the children have been learning the sounds 'e, u and r'. This has included how to say the sound, write the sound and thinking of words that begin with that sound. The children are continuing to read and write tricky words (words that can not be read phonetically, using sounds).

In Write Away, the children have continued to practice their letter formation, holding the pencil in with the correct grip and sitting in a good, comfortable writing position. We have also encouraged the children to write simple CVC words using this weeks letters such as run and cup.

This week we have continued Mathematics Mastery. The children have continued to consolidate their learning of early addition adding two parts together to find the whole/total. The children continue to use concrete representatives such as linking cubes to support their development as well as the part, part whole model.

Homework


Next half term our topic is through the window, therefore we would like the children to create an autumn arts and craft picture. Get creative and use natural materials to make your picture 3D.
