The children enjoyed another musical bumps session with Claire this week and learnt about different tempo of songs, while in PE, we have continued practicing throwing.

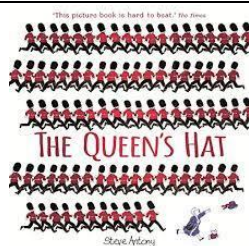
