Reception had a great start of the term. Our Curious Question this half term is "I've learnt about other people, has the world always been this way?". This topic will provide lots of fantastic learning opportunities over the next few weeks. One of our favourite half terms we will be covering topics such as dinosaurs, space, castles and knights and Chinese New Year.

This week our topic has been Castles and Knights- Kings and Queens. The children have been learning about past UK monarchs and features of a castle. They enjoyed various creative activities around this topic as: designing their own crowns and castles or working as a team to build a castle. In Write away, the children have been put in two ability-based groups. This means that they are having tasks tailored to their ability and get appropriate support and challenges. The children practiced writing simple words and sentences using the sounds they have learnt. In Maths, the children have been introduced to zero and practiced partitioning numbers within five. In PE, the children practiced moving in different ways and making shapes using their bodies.

This week, Robins and Wrens have also been introduced to their class Bear. The Bear will live with a different child every week and be part of their family. The first to have the bears are the teachers and we will keep you posted with what they have been up to throughout the week.



We are, now teaching daily phonics. At Ryelands, we follow the BookWings Phonics scheme where phonics is embedded through real books and the new sounds are introduced through story telling. This week the Phonics Fair, introduced the children to the sound: **ch**, **sh**, **th**







