Communication and Language, Personal, Social and Emotional Development and Physical Development, Literacy, Maths.

This week's topic has been "People who help us" and although there are many people who help us every day, we have focused specifically on how firefighters, paramedics and police help us. They have discussed how to be careful around fire, who to call if they are sick or hurt and how to report a crime. The children did lots of creative and writing activities related to their topic. In Maths, we have continued practicing numbers to 20, addition and subtraction. On Thursday, Reception children took part in Sports Day and they impressed us with their team spirit, perseverance and determination.



Mrs Saftoiu's group focused on the correct spelling of the high-flying words and on the presentation of their written work. The children practiced using writing sentences in their best handwriting and using capital letter, finger spaces and full stop.
