Reminders-

- Reception school day 8.50am-3.20pm. In the morning, if you are dropping off, we hope you can spare 5 minutes to support with morning jobs and name writing.
- Every child has their own peg (outside the classroom) where they can hang their coats. They also have their own named tray (inside the classroom) where they can store their jumpers/cardigans and other bits and bobs.
- The children can leave their bookbags in the box and put their lunch boxes in the designated spaces.
- PE kits can be kept in school in the PE boxes (in the infant hall). PE sessions take place on a Friday morning. We will begin PE next week, so we're asking for all PE kits to be in school by then, to ensure all children are able to take part. A kind reminder to PLEASE label the children's clothing/ coats and shoes, especially PE kits. YOU KNOW WHY!
- We are a NUT FREE school, so we kindly ask that lunch boxes do not contain any food containing nuts e.g. Nutella/ peanut butter. We ask that bottles contain water only, as in early years oral health is of great important to us and will be promoting good oral health throughout the year.

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Our Learning Journey

This week we introduced our topic 'Houses and Homes'. The children enjoyed talking about the home they live in and about our neighbourhood. They went on an imaginary aeroplane journey around the world to observe and compare their homes with others. We used a visual map to discuss important features and landmarks of South Norwood and the children worked in teams to create their town using various building materials. We enjoyed reading the story, The three little pigs. Looking at the materials the pigs used to build their houses and how houses and homes are built around the world. On Friday, we enjoyed another PE session. We continue to focus on gross motor movements and spatial awareness in lessons this half term. The children continue to develop their independence in getting changed by themselves and learning the order to do this in, e.g. keep your pants on and put your shoes on last!



Phonics

Have you heard about the Phonics Fairy? This week, we began our daily phonics lessons. Lessons and learning left for us by the Phonics Fairy!

At Ryelands, we follow the Book Wings Phonics scheme where phonics is embedded through real books and sounds are introduced through story telling, with the help of the Phonics Fairy.

This week the children were introduced to the following sounds: **s**, **a**, **t** and **p**. Each lesson provides the children with reading opportunities, speaking activities as well as writing opportunities. The trifactor for creating enthusiastic young readers!

Attached you will find a full list of the Phase 2 sounds and their corresponding Sparkle Mark (letter formation), story book and Caption Action (the action to help us remember the sound).

The Daily Phonics Practice videos have been uploaded to Seesaw. We hope you have had a chance to login using your personal QR code and have enjoyed these videos, as well as the pictures and observations of your child.

Home learning

At Ryelands, we celebrate our diversity and teach our children to be proud of their heritage.

In each classroom we create a display of flags that represent each of our heritages.
