Our Learning Journey

This week our topic in Reception has been Animal Life Cycles. The children have had a fantastic week learning about lots of different animals, including dogs, penguins, chickens, and turtles. The children have enjoyed learning interesting facts about the animals and learning about each of their young. The children learnt about how the young are born, some from an egg and some in a litter. The children wrote excellent sentences during Write Away demonstrating their new knowledge of each animals' life cycle.

In phonics this week, the children have loved reading the Monster Phonics books, showing off their excellent segmenting and blending skills. We continue to be incredibly impressed with the children's reading!

In maths this week, we have been looking at numbers beyond 10. Focusing on counting and writing numbers 11-19. We have taken time to explore the pattern the numbers make, each number having a 1 at the beginning representing the 10, followed by the amount of ones in the teen number. For example, 18 is 1 ten and 8 ones. It is important the children notice the pattern

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to consolidate their number knowledge and support their formation. The children have loved listening to number songs to help consolidate their counting.



Phonics

Its recap and consolodation time!!

As we consolidate learning of phase 2 and 3, we are spending our Phonics lessons, reading Monster Phonics books, playing phonics games and recapping sounds. The children will continue to fill gaps in their knowledge as well as have opportunities to develop their reading skills. This half term we will begin introducing the children to Phase 4. In Phase 4, no new graphemes are introduced. The main aim of this phase is to consolidate the children's knowledge and to help them learn to read and spell words which have adjacent consonants, such as trap, string and milk. The children love playing phonics games, especially Buried Treasure. Phonics games are a great way to practise segmenting and blending skills.
