Our Learning Journey

This week we have been learning about the human body. We spent Monday focusing on growing and changing. Looking at ways we have changed since we were a baby and talked about the skills and knowledge we have gained and look forward to gaining over the years. On Tuesday, the children thought about ways that we can help keep our bodies clean and healthy. We have previously thought about exercise and healthy eating, so on Tuesday we focused on how we keep ourselves clean and our personal hygiene. On Wednesday, we went under the skin and learnt

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about our skeleton and our organs. The children loved learning that there are 206 bones in the human body and that we breath in oxygen and breath out carbon dioxide. Finally on Thursday and Friday, the children loved learning about and exploring the 5 senses. The children learnt about their sense of sight, smell, hearing, taste, and touch, exploring their senses throughout the day in a range of different activities. In maths this week the children have been learning about the days of the week and the months of the year. The children have loved listening to catchy songs on YouTube to help them remember the order. We have also focused on routines, with the children sequencing their day and events in their week, such as Musical Bumps on a Thursday and fish fingers on a Friday. The children continue to impress us in Write Away and Phonics, using their phonics knowledge to decode to read and write.



Phonics



Its recap and consolodation time!!

As we consolidate learning of phase 2 and 3, we are spending our Phonics lessons, reading Monster Phonics books, playing phonics games and recapping sounds. The childrne will continue to fill gaps in their knowledge as well as have opportunities to develop their reading skills.

This half term we will begin introducing the children to Phase 4. In Phase 4, no new graphemes are introduced. The main aim of this phase is to consolidate the children’s knowledge and to help them learn to read and spell words which have adjacent consonants, such as trap, string and milk. The children love playing phonics games, especially Buried Treasure. Phonics games are a great way to practise segmenting and blending skills.
