Our Learning Journey

This week our topic has been Our Planet. The children have learnt about how they can help look after the planet by, Reducing, Recycling and Reusing. The children enjoyed listening to the story 10 things to help my planet, this story sparked a great discussion about ways the children can help, from turning out the light when they leave a room, to walking to school, rather than travelling by car. Whilst talking about recycling, the children talked about how they each help to recycle at home, sharing their knowledge of the different bins and how they can help to reduce

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landfill waste by sorting their rubbish. The children enjoyed learning about what happens to their rubbish once it is collected from their house.

This half term in Maths, we will be recapping our topics from the past year. In Robin class this week we have been looking at 2D shapes. Focusing on counting the sides and identifying the properties of the shape, e.g. a Square has four equal sides. In Wren class the children have been recapping number bonds to 5 and 10, addition and subtraction.

This week the living eggs arrived. What a joy they have brought to the classroom! The children have experienced the wonder of eggs hatching and their first hours of life. Next week, the children will get to enjoy closer interactions with the chicks, as they become stronger and bigger, cuter and fluffier! This weekend the chicks will be spending the weekend with Miss Reed and Elsie (Miss Reed's little best friend). We have set you a fun writing task for your homework, have a look below. Its recap and consolodation time!!

This week we have been working on letter name recognition. Now that the children are secure with their letter sounds, it's important that the children gain a secure understanding of the letter names. Children already demonstrated a good understanding of this; however some letters were less familiar to them. It is important that the children do not now confuse the letter name and the letter sound. However, from this week's learning, it is clear the children understand the difference and have continued to use their letter sound knowledge in their writing.
