Our Learning Journey

This week we have continued the topic 'Our Planet'. The children have focused their learning on the story 'Someone Swallowed Stanley'. A lovely story about a plastic bag, Stanley, who finds his way into the ocean and is swallowed by a whale, a seagull, and a turtle. The story has a great message about how important it is to look after our marine wildlife and our planet. At the end of the story a little boy saves the turtle. The children did some excellent writing this week about the story. Writing about how they can help look after our planet and our marine wildlife. We discussed ways to describe the boy, how the turtle would have felt when it swallowed Stanley and then how it would have felt after the boy saved it.

We have loved having the chicks with us this week, getting to see them grow. The children have loved making posters and signs for the chicks and I'm sure have been talking about them nonstop at home. We are incredibly grateful for your contributions towards the cost of the Living Eggs

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Program. Thank you.

In Maths this week we have continued with our class consolidation lessons. In Robin class, we have been focusing on our number bonds to 10. The children have shown excellent memory skills, reciting, and recalling these number facts.

In Wren class we have recapped partitioning numbers to 10 using part-whole model and halving and doubling numbers within 10.

This week Robin class took to the stage for their very first class assembly. I think we can all agree they did us proud! They learnt their lines, spoke with confidence, and sang beautifully.
