Our Learning Journey

This week we have continued with this half terms Curious Question and been learning about 'Our Heritage and Guy Fawkes' Night'.

The children have enjoyed learning about one another's families this week, finding out about countries all around the world and their traditions. The children enjoyed looking at a range of flags and learnt about how these represent each country.

In Maths this week, we have been exploring number 5. The children have taken part in a range of practical activities to understand how 5 can be represented. We have also been focusing on number formation this week. We have noticed lots of children are forming their numbers backwards, we have linked our homework to this. In Write Away this week, we have been reading the story of 'Handa's Surprise'. The children loved this story and enjoyed looking at the different animals and fruits. The children have impressed us with their ability to recognise and hear the initial sounds in words, such as b – banana and a – avocado.

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Phonics

The Phonics Fairy Fun continued this week in Robin and Wren class!

We continue to teach phonics daily. At Ryelands, we follow the BookWings Phonics scheme, where phonics is embedded through real books and the new sounds are introduced through story telling.

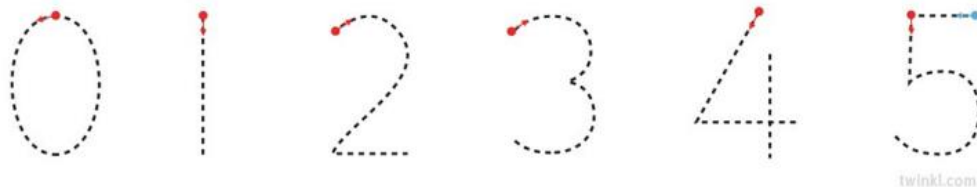
This week the Phonics Fairy introduced the children to the sounds: **h**, **b**, and **f**, as well as a new High Flying Word: 'go'.

Home learning

As mentioned earlier, we are working on our number formation in class. We would like the children this week to practice forming their numbers 0,1,2,3,4 and 5.
